

Technical Group SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORT & GREEN SHIPPING

Whilst Maritime transport is one of the most energy efficient forms of transport, it still responsible for over a tenth of transport CO2 emissions.

Early movers in the shipping industry have already taken steps to invest in green solutions, including by using alternative cleaner fuels, innovative propulsion power and increasing the energy efficiency of their ships. It is important to recognise and incentivize such efforts that further stimulate innovation.

The Aim of the Technical Group is to establish cooperation within the Mediterranean for the research and deployment of innovative solutions for clean maritime transport.

Technical Group for Aquaculture **AQUAWEST**



Aquaculture could meet up to two-thirds of global seafood consumption by 2030 but practices can have a significant impact on the environment and aquatic biodiversity. So there is a need for sustainable development in aquaculture, which has the potential to address the challenges aquaculture facing today.

The Westmed Technical Group aims to promote and accelerate existing cooperation at the Western Mediterranean level to support the deployment of innovative solutions for the development of economically and socially sustainable and resilient aquaculture

- Bring together a group of national experts from each WestMED country from the aquaculture sector, to facilitate dialogue between national and regional economic actors,
- Identify, share and valorise the best practices of sustainable aquaculture through the exchange and transfer of knowledge
- Identify funding and strategic projects which can be implemented across the region.
- **Promote the establishment of scientific partnerships** between aquaculture research centres and companies in the South

MARITIME CLUSTERS ALLIANCE



Maritime Clusters promote the uptake of innovation, knowledge, skills as well as access to finance – which is not easily attainable particularly for SMEs. In aquaculture alone, the sector consists of around 15,000 enterprises, mainly small businesses or microenterprises in coastal and rural areas.

Tourism is one of the largest sectors generating income across the Mediterranean.

Impact of COVID-19 on the sector – Efforts are focused to building and strengthening the resilience of the sector through effective and efficient governance systems at the local and international level.

The aim of the Sustainable Tourism Working Group is to create synergies with and between key stakeholders in the tourism sector of the WestMED Initiative with a focus on sustainability. The potential for capitalisation and synergies amongst regional projects, towards a "leveraging-up" of current practices in sustainable tourism (operators and policymakers) across the Mediterranean.

BLUE SKILLS AND OCEAN LITERACY

SKILLS: Our coasts and seas have the potential to deliver sustainable growth and jobs in the coming years. This will only be possible if we invest in new, blue skills and career development.

OCEAN LITERACY : Understanding how we influence the ocean and how the ocean influences us.

To promote and popularise the Ocean Literacy concept and enhance countries' skills and expertise in this field, through training, exchanges, awarenessraising and research activities aimed at society, on maritime and marine environmental issues specifically and the blue economy more generally.
